Look What's Happening at ARISE in Madison County

ARISE is excited to combine its Independent Living services in Madison County with its inclusive recreation programs at ARISE at the Farm within a renovated and expanded building at the Farm on New Boston Road in Chittenango.

Renovations to our existing barn started in the fall, and construction crews made quick work of building a brand-new addition to the barn. Work is expected to wrap up soon in the New Year. Our one-of-a-kind interdisciplinary Independent Living Center for Madison County will be the hub for services like Community Habilitation, Education Advocacy, Independent Living Skills Training and Peer Counseling as well as adaptive horseback riding, Farm Camp and other inclusive recreation programs. The addition creates new accessible stalls so that all riders can tack and groom their horses more readily. The addition also houses a new hay loft and larger tack room. We renovated existing work space and created new accessible offices, upgraded the kitchen area for staff and installed information technology upgrades. These changes complement our existing Farm facilities like our fully inclusive playground, sensory trail and paved "people path." A grant from New York State's Nonprofit Infrastructure Capital Investment Program (NICIP) and private donors made much of the project possible.







Adaptive Design Workshop Moves

ARISE Adaptive Design has a new home in the recently renovated ARISE building at 635 James Street in Syracuse. The end of the lease in the workshop's former location perfectly coincided with the new space's availability. No matter the location, ARISE Adaptive

Design brings together talented and committed volunteers and families to design and build custom adaptive equipment from low-cost materials like sturdy cardboard and with tools like 3-D printers. The new workshop site offers better parking, more accessibility, and more flexible space than the previous site. Connor McGough, ARISE Adaptive Design Program Coordinator, said "I'm excited about all the new memories that we will create at our new location. With a new year comes new

opportunities, and this is especially true with a new, improved and centrally located workshop. Stay tuned everyone, big things are ahead for ARISE Adaptive Design!"

Wheelchair Charging Stations

A new wheelchair and scooter recharging station is onsite at ARISE's Syracuse office! Thanks to funding from the National Association of Chronic Disease Directors and a partnership between ARISE and HealtheConnections, this charging station is available for individuals who need a boost for their power wheelchairs or scooters. Similar chargers are in place in Oswego and the New York State Fairgrounds thanks in part to the work of ARISE advocates.

The unit was developed by the Clearview Disability Resource Center in Pendleton, Oregon. Three more charging stations will be donated to parks in and around Syracuse this spring.
